What Faith Looks Like in Learning

Faith is more than positive thinking. Faith is hearing God's Word, believing God's Word, speaking God's Word, and acting on God's Word. *Romans 10:17* says, "faith cometh by hearing, and hearing by the word of God." As your child speaks these truths consistently, they truly believe what God says—and when pressure comes, His Word flows out of their hearts.

How to use this resource: Read these confessions aloud 1 to 3 times each day, especially before school, tutoring, homework, tests, or moments of frustration. Do not focus on perfect reading or performance. Even when the mind does not fully understand yet, God's Word is getting down deep into the heart, renewing the mind, and bringing transformation from the inside out.

Preparation for Learning and Battle

Father, in the name of Jesus, I declare that I am strong in you, Lord, and in the power of your might. The joy of the Lord is my strength, so I stand firm as a joyful, peaceful, and steady student.

By faith, I put on the whole armour of God. I put on the **belt of truth**, which means I receive, read, and understand your Word.
